The Classics Department welcomes student applications for the 2025 Jacob Jasper Stahl Fellowship for the Study of Mediterranean Antiquity for student study, research or travel. This fellowship will support opportunities to:

- Study ancient Greek or Latin languages in programs offered abroad or in intensive language programs offered at universities in the United States
- 2) Participate in archaeological excavations that focus on Greek, Roman or ancient Mediterranean cultures
- Participate in an internship at a museum or other cultural institution that centers on the study of Greek, Roman or ancient Mediterranean cultures
- 4) Take a course on Greek, Roman or ancient Mediterranean subject matter offered abroad during winter or summer breaks

Interested students should submit a grant application to the department by February 25, 2025 via email to the department coordinator, Sandy Kauffman (<u>skauffma@bowdoin.edu</u>). The application should include:

- 1) A description of the program in which they plan to participate
- 2) Their background in the subject matter and a description or how the project will fit into their studies at Bowdoin.
- 3) A detailed budget that includes items such as tuition, room and board, and travel costs
- 4) A letter of recommendation from a Bowdoin faculty member.

Students do not need to be majors or minors in the department in order to apply; indeed, first-years and sophomores are welcome. However, students should demonstrate a sustained commitment to the study of the ancient Mediterranean during their academic career at Bowdoin.
